Prayer for the Week

1. Dear Father, thank you for making it possible for me to live in dominion over circumstances, and to walk in alignment with your purpose at all times. By the power of the Holy Spirit, I live as Jesus did, in righteousness, pleasing you in all things, in Jesus' Name.

2. Dear Father, you've given me all-round prosperity; I'm prospering spiritually, financially, and I'm healthy, vibrant and strong. I'm standing firm like a flourishing tree planted by your design, deeply rooted by the brooks of bliss, bearing fruits of righteousness, ever blessed, ever luscious, in Jesus' Name.

3. I have the very life and nature of God in me because I'm born again. This God-life makes me impregnable, causing me to walk in victory, glory, dominion, and excellence always, in Jesus' Name.

4. Dear Father, thank you for making me an overseer of your flock. I have the grace to care for each soul under my charge, interceding for them with passion and fervency. [For I always pray to] the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, that He may grant you a spirit of wisdom and revelation [of insight into mysteries and secrets] in the [deep and intimate] knowledge of Him (Ephesians 1:17 AMPC).

In Matthew 16:13-20, Jesus asked His disciples a pressing pair of questions bordering on His identity. First, He asked them, "Whom do men say that I the Son of man am?" After getting their responses. He then asked the second question: "...But whom say ye that I am?" (Matthew 16:15). The Bible says, "...Simon Peter answered and said, Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:16). Peter's confession of Jesus as the Christ was a revelation from God. but Peter didn't know it; He thought it was his reasoning. Jesus had to tell him: "...Blessed art thou, Simon Barjona: for flesh and blood hath not revealed it unto thee, but my Father which is in heaven" (Matthew 16:17). Hallelujah! Just like Peter, many of God's people have received revelations from God. Think about it: How did you know Jesus is the Christ? It's the Holy Spirit that revealed it to your spirit. The Bible says, "...no man can say that Jesus is the Lord. but by the Holy Ghost" (1 Corinthians 12:3).

You believe the Virgin Birth of Jesus Christ; you read about it in the Scriptures and believed. That was the Holy Spirit granting you insight into that mystery. Likewise, the resurrection of Jesus Christ; you weren't there when it happened, but you believe. Also, you believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, and that He died for your sins and God raised Him from the dead, and He's alive today; that's a revelation from God. Your brain can't figure out such truths. Science can never give them to you. You have them in your spirit because God made them known to your spirit.

It's part of the ministry of the Spirit in us: the unveiling of truth. So, trust Him with your life. Make knowing Him more and living His Word your greatest passion. Through that fellowship, He'll keep unveiling Himself and the greater mysteries of the Kingdom to you.

SPEAKING MYSTERIES IN THE SPIRIT.

But we speak the wisdom of God in a mystery, even the hidden wisdom, which God ordained before the world unto our glory (1 Corinthians 2:7).

Life is full of mysteries, unanswered questions, events and activities beyond human understanding. As Christians, our way of dealing with these mysteries is by speaking mysteries. Rather than wonder about negative circumstances, we cancel them by speaking spiritual mysteries.

The Bible says, "For he that speaketh in an unknown tongue speaketh not unto men, but unto God: for no man understandeth him; howbeit in the spirit he speaketh mysteries" (1 Corinthians 14:2). When we pray in tongues, we're uttering divine mysteries inspired by the Holy Spirit. At such times, your spirit reaches into the realm of the spirit, just as the Bible says, "Deep calleth unto deep..." (Psalm 42:7). Then 1 Corinthians 2:10-11 says, "...for the Spirit searcheth all things, yea, the deep things of God. For what man knoweth the things of a man, save the spirit of man which is in him? even so the things of God knoweth no man, but the Spirit of God."

These mysteries of the Spirit that are unknown to men are unveiled to us by the Holy Spirit: "Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God. Which things also we speak, not in the words which man's wisdom teacheth, but which the Holy Ghost teacheth..." (1 Corinthians 2:12-13). Notice that it says, "...Which things also we speak, not in the words which man's wisdom teacheth, but which the Holy Ghost teacheth...." Cultivate the habit of speaking in tongues often. As you do, you speak things into your future. You settle matters and take care of things in the realm of the spirit so that when the time of crisis comes, you just laugh your way through.

This is why God wants us to pray all the time in the spirit: "Praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, and watching thereunto with all perseverance and supplication for all saints" (Ephesians 6:18).
